A Note About Access to Databases

There are two ways to access library databases:

- 1. **ON campus:** All databases are accessible from any computer that accesses the Internet via the Campus Network. Choose the "Research Databases" link.
- 2. **OFF campus:** Use the "Off-Campus Login" link. Enter your UC account username and password. This is the same login info used to access your UC email and Web CT accounts.
